Supporting our community through the cost of living challenges

The cost of living challenges are apparent to us all, and as we move into the colder and darker winter months the extra money we need to spend on our gas and electricity bills is a significant factor in everyone's budget.

East Ayrshire Council have committed resources to address this challenge, and throughout East Ayrshire they are assisting communities to promote 'Warm Spaces' where people can get a warm welcome, perhaps take part in an activity or just socialise and connect with friends.
