

Dear friends & neighbours,

It can be easy to look back with rosetinted glasses, or even to look back and imagine that people of years past would have little understanding of how we live today. But recently in church, in our scripture readings, we came across a word which is very familiar in today's world, and which many think of as a modern phenomenon.

That word is "anxiety," and it appears in a Letter written almost 2,000 years ago to the very first Christians—people who were struggling to work through what their new faith meant for their relationships and way of life. Many of them felt isolated, worried about the present and uncertain about the future.

Anxiety is certainly not a modern phenomenon, it is something that people have been experiencing for a very long time—millennia! Recently, I've had a few quite deep conversations with different people about their experiences of the pandemic, and how it continues to upset and affect them. Some have shared their worries about the lasting impact on children and young people, and others are concerned about those who remain isolated due to health reasons or through fear.

The advice of the Letter we read in church was "to cast all your anxiety on God, because he cares for you." Valuable and loving advice, which we can follow in our prayers and in the various different ways we can manage our anxiety—breathing exercises, meditation etc.

If your anxiety is overwhelming and you feel you need additional support, then you should have a chat with your GP about that. Casting our anxiety on God who cares for us should also give us the confidence to share our worries and fears with others who can offer us support and care.

The people who spoke to me about their lingering pandemic anxieties said they felt a bit better for talking about it. If you think it would be a good idea to get a wee group together who can simply talk and listen to each other, in mutual confidence and care, then please get in touch.

In the meantime, I offer you the blessing of God who knows our joys and our sorrows, who willingly takes on our burdens, and who cares deeply for us all.
