

# **Dunlop and Lugton Community Action Plan**

A Community Led Action Plan provides a road map for implementing community change and improving the delivery of essential services. It describes what the community wants to achieve and clarifies what will be done, who will do it and how it will be done.

Over the next few months, Dunlop & Lugton Community Council will be co-ordinating the preparation of a Community Led Action Plan for our local villages and surrounding rural area.

The first stage is to carry out a survey of as many people as possible who live in the Dunlop and Lugton area. Volunteer distributors will be delivering paper copies of the simple survey to every household in the area in early March. Online options will also be available and young people will be able to participate through their schools. The survey aims to highlight things people like and dislike about our local area and from this, key themes can be identified. The resulting plan will help us to address the problems, needs, and potential of our community and will allow actions to be focussed on where changes can be made for the better.

When you receive your survey, please don't ignore it. We want the widest possible range of opinions – the greater the response, the easier it will be to identify priorities.

Warm Space films are free, with thanks to East Ayrshire Council for providing funding. Our usual two films are being run with the usual prices, with tickets available from *ticketebo.co.uk/dunlopcc*. Any difficulty buying online please do contact us at *dunlopcinema@outlook.com* for assistance. Please also email us at the same address if you would like to be added to our mailing list.

We would prefer you to buy your tickets online. This guarantees entry if we sell out and helps us know how many people are coming. There is a service charge, but it is only 75p per transaction (not per ticket) which we feel is very reasonable. If we do not sell out, tickets will be available on the door at a cost of £7.

Doors open 30 minutes before screenings commence. There will be a bar, popcorn, and ice cream for paid screenings only. For warm space screenings, there will be free soup on Thurs 23rd (plus the usual café refreshments), but on the 11th we will not be selling any refreshments, and encourage people to bring their own (however, there will be free tea and coffee).
