It is based on a true event, about an entire extended family returning to China ostensibly for a wedding, but actually to say goodbye to the matriarch of the family. Their grandmother has cancer, but, in keeping with Chinese tradition, is not being told of her diagnosis – it is for

the family to shoulder the burden of this knowledge. It is both funny and moving, and reminds us that home is more than a fixed place – it is also the people who surround us.

An extraordinary, humbling, and emotional true story about Sir Nicholas Winton (Anthony Hopkins and Johnny Flynn), co-written by his daughter. He rescued over 600 children from Nazioccupied Czechoslovakia, by organising his own Kindertransport, assisted by his mother (Helena Bonham-Carter). His achievements were unknown for nearly

50 years, until his wife came across documents relating to the rescue in the attic. The story eventually became known through the programme 'That's Life'.
