Dear friends & neighbours,

Storm Éowyn at the end of January certainly made its mark! From our first experience of the new emergency alert system which set off sirens on phones and tablets, to trees toppled across fields, roads and burns, and of course the power cuts which affected so many, some for several days. We discovered that Dunlop and surrounding areas are supplied with electricity from several different sources, and so the power returned gradually, area by area or street by street. We were fortunate that the Kirk had electricity and so we were able to provide a warm space for people, along with hot drinks and the chance to charge devices. On the Sunday afternoon, we were able to move our warm space up the Church Hall, and

thanks to generous donations, were able to offer tasty soup, rolls and biscuits to those who came by.

The biggest challenge for us was communication - how best to tell people that we were open for them. Our local community Facebook pages are a great resource, and I encourage everyone who can to join Facebook as it does provide a quick and easy way to share information and help. We're a pretty resilient community, good at looking out for each other, especially in times of crisis. I've been speaking with East Ayrshire Council about what we can learn from this experience and what support they can offer to help us in any similar situations in the future, particularly how we can tell people where to find help.

And a closing thought - the hymns for our Sunday service had been chosen before the storm, but it was striking how many of the verses we sang contained the word "power"! Particularly poignant when many of us didn't have any electrical power, but a reassuring reminder of the power of God which is beyond our imagining, but which heals and sustains us.

May we all know God's power in our home and our lives,


