

Please look out for our adverts nearer the time, which will give details of where to buy your tickets.



Our next exhibition opens on Thursday 7th September, featuring the work of Tina Sloan.



A plea to some frontagers

This is the time of year when all is activity in our gardens and growth in the gardens themselves. How easy is it on our narrow pavements because of hedge growth and car parking to walk with a pram or even side by side, a child by the hand? There are now also several disabled scooter users and concern re problems of

parking and wide hedges have been expressed.

Hedges we CAN deal with ourselves. Can you look under your hedge and see a wall? That wall is the back edge of the pavement. Does your hedge overlap, narrowing the pedestrian area? The Community Council is politely asking you to please give all the pavement back and trim your hedge to the line of the wall. Don't worry, it will grow back to restore privacy but on its new width, and with pedestrians' comfort and safety much better.

There is legislation in the Roads Scotland Act to cover this situation but that is a great big hammer.
