Spring has sprung! As I write this, the sun is shining, birds are singing, daffodils are flowering, lambs are gambolling, there's a definite warmth in the air, and snow is forecast for Good Friday! I did say at the start of the year that I was enthusiastic about the snow, having been deprived of it as a child near the coast, but even I am growing a little weary of it now. On the upside, the snow has been very effective at filling the pot holes in our roads, although it's no doubt partially responsible for their formation.

We entered the final stage of our journey towards Easter on Palm Sunday, when the road in front of Jesus was resurfaced in a mood of celebration and jubilation by the cheering crowds as they threw down cloaks and palm branches. But just as the new warmth of our spring weather threatens to return to the cold of winter, so too was the mood of the crowds ready to turn from welcome to accusation.

Holy Week is a time of deep and deeply felt emotions - hope, fear, joy, sorrow, love, hate ... A time when we are encouraged to reflect on our own thoughts, feelings and relationships - with each other, with God, with our own selves.

All are welcome to join in our services during Holy Week as we explore these themes of emotions and relationships. At our Maundy Thursday Service we shall gather to share Holy Communion, serving each other with the bread and wine, then sharing more food and tea/coffee together after the service. Our Good Friday service will be a quiet and thoughtful Tenebrae service as we recall and retell the story of Jesus' final steps on the journey to the cross. These evening services will start at 7pm.

And an early start on Easter Sunday morning - with a service in the garden of the Manse, at Dam Park, at 6.30am. Bacon rolls will be served after this service. There will be a short service of Holy Communion after morning worship at the usual time of 11.30am in the church.

Before then, I shall have the pleasure of welcoming the Primary School to the Church for their Easter Service. I'm sure all the teaching and other staff, and the children will be looking forward to their holidays - snow or sunshine! Maybe we'll have both this year!
