Dear friends and neighbours,

As this strangest of years draws to a close, Christmas trees and lights have been appearing in windows and gardens much earlier than usual. We're all looking for ways to keep our hopes and spirits up as this pandemic continues to restrict our lives through the dark days of winter. Light and darkness are age-old metaphors for hope and despair, so these beacons and displays of light are a very human response to this situation in which we all find ourselves.

It seems fitting that this very basic human expression of hope should herald the beginning of Advent. Advent, that time of waiting and preparation for the season of Christmas, gives us a chance to ponder the humanity of Jesus. A baby, then boy, then man who was both fully divine and also at the same time, fully human. God come to us in human form, born of a woman, raised within a family and a wider community. His parents, family and community were all, at different times and in different ways affected by events and circumstances which were beyond their control. Like us, Jesus knew what it was to suffer and grieve, just as he also knew what it was to enjoy companionship and happiness. His life is a demonstration that God is not only with us in every aspect of our humanity, but that God has first hand experience of all that being human is all about.

Although we cannot have our usual service and procession of light for the switch-on of our Christmas Lights and Nativity Scene, we plan to be all lit up on Monday, 30th November, to mark the start of Advent. Throughout Advent, you'll be able to share in our Dunlop Community Nativity on-line - all contributions welcome as we tell the Nativity Story in our own way.

And finally, some "light at the end of the tunnel" of the reopening of the church building - we hope to be able to make application very soon to Presbytery and all going well, and God willing, to have the church open before Christmas.
