## Multi-purpose Extension – Dunlop Kirk

You may recall that during the major repair and refurbishment of the church the original vestry was altered to provide toilets (including a wheelchair access toilet) to meet current building standards. This meant that there was no longer a private space for the minister to meet with anyone who wished to speak to him before or after the service and there was no easily-accessed crèche space for babies and toddlers.

To solve this problem of privacy and space it was proposed that we build an extension and it was hoped that the multi-purpose character of the extension would also allow flexibility for congregation and community use.

Because of the listed building status of the church and its sensitive setting within a churchyard filled with graves, a pre-planning meeting was held with Historic Scotland and East Ayrshire Council last year to explore various options.

After much deliberation, it was agreed that the most appropriate site for any additional accommodation would be alongside the former vestry, where it would be less visible and where there were no gravestones. As a first step in a complicated process to obtain all necessary approvals, a planning application has now been submitted to East Ayrshire Council, but everyone should be aware that it is likely to be some time before we are in a position to proceed and designs may change during the approvals process.


# **Dunlop Friends of the Ayrshire Hospice**
