Dear friends and neighbours,

Along with almost everyone else in and around Dunlop, I've been tuning in to Channel 4 of a Friday evening to watch Deadwater Fell. At the time of writing, we are two episodes in, and the plot is looking ever more complex. I'd be struggling to follow it anyway, as I'm probably more absorbed in looking out for familiar places and faces than keeping track of the to-ing and fro-ing of the action, which moves from past to present and back again.

It is quite a strange experience to watch this drama as it's a mixture of the familiar and the new. We recognise friends and neighbours, our streets, houses, the school and the church - and yet it is all at the same time, changed and unfamiliar. As I said in church on Sunday morning, this confusing mix of old and new must have been what it was like for those people who first encountered Jesus. The familiar words of the Hebrew scriptures were invoked by and about a man who was doing the unexpected, the unanticipated.

And just as we are drawn into the scriptures by stories of people and places, so too have we been drawn to watch our own places and our own people on screen in an unfamiliar, and as yet unresolved story. By the time you receive this February copy of Dunlop Diary the plot will have been unravelled and explained, but in the meantime, while the printing presses are got ready, I'm looking forward to Friday and scanning the TV for familiar people and places.

And enjoying the unfamiliar sight of Main Street with no cars!
