Dear friends and neighbours,

I have a confession to make. This year I managed to be unusually organised and had my son's Easter egg bought and hidden away long before Lent had even started. Unfortunately, I accidentally ate that Easter egg.

Now I have a dilemma. Should I replace that Easter egg now and risk another accidental eating? Or should I wait until just before Easter to buy it, and prevent any accidental eating by presenting it to my son at the check-out?

A third, very seasonal, option would be to enter into the spirit of Lent and focus on resisting temptation. After all, in a way, Shrove Tuesday or Pancake Day is designed as the last opportunity for any accidental eating before the 40 days of Lent when people traditionally fasted as a spiritual exercise modelled upon the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness, hungry, alone and tempted by the devil. And the thing about temptation is that it's a calling to our weaknesses, our vulnerabilities. I would have no problem giving up cheese-cake for Lent as I don't like it and never eat it anyway. But chocolate ...

So, the challenge of resisting temptation is about being honest with ourselves about our weaknesses, and instead of turning away, facing them head on. Lent is about much more than self-denial. It is about self-knowledge. Being able to admit to temptation and resist it, is to know ourselves more fully - to know ourselves as God intends us to be, and to fulfil our God-given potential.

So, I have decided. This year, for Lent, I will buy another Easter egg for my son. I will put it somewhere I can see it every day, and I will. not. eat. it! (But if I do accidentally eat it, which I'm sure I won't, I will not be discouraged. I will get another Easter egg and start again.)
