Dear friends and neighbours,

By the time you receive this month's Diary the clocks will have fallen back, the nights will have drawn in, and we'll be hunkering down and cosying in for winter. Hallowe'en costumes will have been put away till next year, pumpkins will have been put out for the birds (and out of reach of hedgehogs), and guisers might have eaten all their sweeties! There will be a certain "woolliness" about the parish, red and purple remembrance of the past prompting hope for a peaceful future - for all God's creatures - people and animals alike.

The whole of God's creation - this world and all that lives and grows on it - is the focus of COP26, the Climate Change Conference taking place in Glasgow over the first two weeks of November. 
Christmas Cards Dunlop Kirk
