Sunday 13th September

Do you enjoy a stroll in the countryside? Are you looking for a challenge? Do you have a budding athlete at home? Do you like cake? If the answer to all these questions is YES! Then come along and take part in this year's RunDunlop, the community fun run with a cake at the end.

Starting at 2pm on Sunday 13th with a choice of 2k, 5k and 10k races, there is a distance to suit everyone. The 2km is a great opportunity for children to run, walk and have a laugh with family and friends. You could take the pram or the dog, take your time and enjoy the walk. For those who prefer something a little more challenging, the 5km and 10km routes should make you sweat. No matter which distance you choose, you will be helping to raise funds for Dunlop Primary School and other local organisations.

Registration for the races can be done in advance online via www.rundunlop.wordpress.com or from 12.30-1.45 on the day. Entry costs are £14 for the 10k, £8 for the 5k and £2 for the 2k. We can only hope that this year's race will be as successful as last year's. 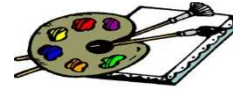
Everyone is very welcome to join our morning services at 11.30am and the church is also open every Sunday afternoon until the end of October, from 2-4pm.

Parking – An issue that arises regularly at Community Council meetings is the frequency of irresponsible parking in the village, and the problems this causes. Parking on the pavements (eg at the station) prevents people on mobility scooters and parents with buggies from getting past, parking at narrow sections of road makes it difficult for vehicles to pass, parking in restricted areas outside the school is dangerous and irresponsible. There is no easy solution to the lack of parking in the village and nobody wants to see parking restrictions imposed and yellow lines appearing, so when you park your car, please don't just think of your own convenience – think about pedestrians and other road users and park responsibly.

Defibrillator – in a joint venture between the Community Council and Dunlop & District Community Company, a defibrillator will shortly be installed outside the Village Hall. Once installed, a training session will be arranged for anyone interested in knowing how to use it. Watch the Notice Boards for details.

Care for your community

As many of you will be aware one of the most powerful and valuable features of life in and around Dunlop is the strength of its community spirit. This is clearly evident in the wide range of clubs and activities available within the village and is also reflected in the open to all public facilities run by local volunteer groups.

Unfortunately two of these facilities have in the recent past been the subject of distressing vandalism. Within the children's play area of the Park a section of the slide has been destroyed, apparently by a child using another child's scooter as a hammer. There are also reports of a child using a pellet type gun in the park and firing it in another child's face. More recently there are also reports of wilful damage to plants and shrubs in the Wee Garden.

In addition to the extra volunteer time and effort required to resolve these damages there is also considerable cost, the section of slide alone will be around £450 of locally raised funds, your money, to replace.

Fortunately, thankfully such incidences are not common and as such are all the more alarming and upsetting when they do occur. To help take care of your facilities, support those who voluntarily maintain them and keep our community a safe happy place to be it is important that we all do what we can to minimise these incidents.

It's also possible that those responsible and maybe their families need some extra support and guidance so if you can help identify the culprit/s please contact Stewarton police office on 101, it can be in confidence and it will make a difference. Thank you.
