My eye has been caught by the death of Brian Rix, the actor-manager and theatre producer. In the 1950's when I was a young national serviceman in the London area, he was the top of the bill in the Whitehall Theatre with full houses for his farces.

Later, in my church drama group, I produced and acted in one of his great hits, "Chase Me, Comrade", a cold war spoof, in which I had to speak Russian (my version!) and run in and out of cupboards and curtains. Great fun!

But Brian Rix had a serious side, and, when his first child, Shelley was born, suffering from Down's Syndrome, he became gradually immersed not only in her disability but the learning and other disabilities of many more.

Ably supported by his Scottish wife he gave up his theatre success, became secretary general of Mencap, an outspoken apologist for the handicapped. And a fund-raiser par excellence.

In the church we sometimes talk about 'the call' to ministry. Myself, I prefer to call it 'a job' in which one can be dedicated and hard-working. Brian Rix is a good example of how you do not need to be a minister to be 'called', and no one worked harder than he did for others.

Brian knew there was more to life than success, money, acclaim. His daughter's need taught him that. Blessings to you and your families
