Friday night is cinema night! Just as the autumn nights begin to draw in, the Dunlop Community Cinema returns with another Oscar-laden treasure trove of films. Our first film of the season is on Friday 13th September. 'First Man', the story of a monumental moment of human history and the man who was to become the first man on the moon. The exhilaration (and danger) of space exploration set against the backdrop of the sacrifices a grieving Armstrong made on his journey into the history books.

For our next film on 4th October, we remain in the 1960s with 'Green Book', the story of a working class Italian-American bouncer who becomes the driver to a world-class black pianist on a tour of the Deep South. Based on a true story, the odd couple bond as they travel through the states on a road trip beset with humiliations and prejudice. Brilliant performances from both Viggo Mortensen and Mahershala Ali, are what make this road movie something special.

The 25th of October brings another Oscar-winner, 'The Favourite'. A jet-black comedy/period drama set in the 18th century court of the gout-inflicted Queen Anne. Full of intrigue, Anne's court is rife with scheming and manipulation, and serves as the perfect background to the competition that develops for the Queen's affection between her oldest friend and lover, and a young kitchen servant. A rich, dark and sumptuous film, the three female leads (Olivia Coleman, Rachel Weisz and Emma Stone) are deliciously nasty. At the very least you'll come out of this with some interesting insults...

Make the most of your Friday night and join us in the Village Hall. Thanks to our voucher scheme, if you come often enough, and collect 5 'stars', your sixth film is free. So, why not come along and relax with a soothing beverage (alcoholic or non-alcoholic), some popcorn or ice-cream, we look forward to seeing you.
