The Clandeboye's Hall, alongside the church, is an 'A' listed building, which was built in 1641 and was one of the first free schools in Scotland. Behind the Clandeboyes is the Hans Hamilton Tomb where the marble figures of the former minister and his wife have been reinstated.

The Sunday morning service is at 11.30 and the Church will then be open again from 2-4pm. You are very welcome to come along at either time and as always tea, coffee and biscuits will be available.
