News from the Dunlop and District Community Company

Dunlop Village Hall: All the groups are up and running for the new term and the coffee machine is now available for coffee and hot Chocolate when open. We are looking for volunteers to open the hall up on a Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday morning to provide access to the library and all the other activities within the village hall. If you can volunteer for a few hours every month, this will help us open the hall on a more regular basis.

Dunlop Park and Pavilion: Work is underway to refurbish the Pavilion which

will be the next stage in making the park more usable. If we can obtain funding we want to improve drainage to ensure the pitch can be used by all on a regular basis.

Commoncraig Woodland Path and Bridge:

£90,000 has been secured towards the replacement of the bridge over the Glazert Burn and the development of an accessible, weather proof path network around Commoncraig. We are hoping to secure the balance of funding in May, enabling us to proceed this year. There is a requirement for a community

fundraising event to cover the community contribution and this will centre around the Jubilee concert on the 24th May. We will be having a special raffle at the event with two prizes: A Garmin Forerunner watch and a GoPro action camera. Do come along for a great night and support the Commoncraig development.

Also, come along to the Company AGM on April 28th at 7.30pm in the Village Hall to hear more about what is going on, what is planned and to see how you could support these initiatives.

Funding for Dunlop and Lugton Community Projects

Following recent filming in the area, Dunlop and Lugton Community Council has received a donation from Sister Coldwater to be allocated to community use. This has been match funded by East Ayrshire Council resulting in a total of £10,000 being available to community groups, individuals and organisations for projects in the Dunlop and Lugton area.

The funding will be distributed through a Participatory Budgeting process and supported projects must meet one of the following priorities:

• Improving the health and wellbeing of the local community

• Improving the environment of the local community

The maximum a project can apply for is £750 with no lower limit for bids. Groups and individuals may submit applications for up to 2 projects.
